



Community Concerns from Survey Results

- Use of taxpayer dollars to pay for a new stadium
- Lack of parking enforcement
- Traffic and emergency vehicle access
- Public drunkenness and drunk driving
- Increase in crime, noise, public urination
- Increase in trash, rats, and pollution
- Tailgating in parking lots and other disruptive behavior
- Imminent Domain

Neighborhood Needs

- \$375,000 for city-water connection for the Kingman Park-Rosedale Community Garden (funds expired and concerns about ground well-water contamination)
- <u>Rosedale Library must stay in Rosedale</u>, expand current site to full service library
- Address crime in the neighborhood (carjackings, robberies, drug activity etc.)
- Address parking and traffic safety concerns especially during festival events
- Triangle Park Oral History Art Project has been stuck in bureaucracy for years
- Farmers Market, Food Hall, Expand The Fields, More Sports, Dog Park
- Historic Kingman Park neighborhood designation flags
- Soundproof barriers for communities along the highways

Questions for Mayor Bowser

- **1. Community Needs:** People prefer to see this land be used for parks, recreation, arts, multigenerational housing before using this land for a stadium; how do you propose meeting the community's desire to see these items?
- 2. Taxpayer Dollars and Funding: You have shared that it will be tough to fund all the things the city needs, our community has been told that there is no money in the budget for pressing needs; will you be using taxpayer dollars to fund the development of a stadium for the Commanders?
- **3. Traffic and Quality of Life:** We see the events (like Broccoli Festival and the National Cannabis Festivals) that EventsDC puts on and they create immense headaches for the neighborhood, creating wall-to-wall traffic, trash, drunk people in the neighborhood; what measures would you propose to ensure the quality of life for residents surrounding the stadium site isn't negatively impacted?

Questions for Mayor Bowser

- 4. Community Involvement in Decision Making: How will you involve this community in the decision-making process since this would make a huge impact on our lives? What is the whole timeline from now to when DC makes it's bid – how long would that be? How will you take into account site usage planning, funding planning, environmental concerns?
- 5. Environmental and Health Concerns: We read the environmental impact study from the 1990s and it looks like chromium levels and lead levels are very high, among others. If you were to build a stadium, how would you remediate these environmental concerns and when would the next environmental study happen?
- 6. Vision for RFK Site: We know you want the Commanders, they might go somewhere else, what is your vision for this space if the Commanders choose to go to VA or MD?

Additional Questions

- 7. What other sites is the city considering are there sites downtown where all the abandoned office buildings are?
- 8. The permit on the Fields is temporary **could the Fields be taken away** if you build a stadium?
- 9. Eminent Domain How many homes were taken in eminent domain for the other stadiums? How many do you plan to take for this stadium?
- 10. We don't need a sea of empty parking lots How would you address parking for the stadium?
- 11. Virginia may bid \$1.5 billion; what would DC's bid look like?

Additional Questions

12. How many seats in the stadium do you want?

- **13. How much traffic** will that bring to our neighborhoods? When will the **traffic study** be done?
- 14. How many days a year would the stadium hold events?
- 15. Could there be an **infill metro station** where the Streetcar ends?
- 16. Can we have a **permanent contact in Mayor's office** to get our pressing questions answered?
